What does the Community Program do?

The Community Program aims to help Young Parents to manage all the challenges that parenting and life can bring. This then paves the path for Young Parents to fully embrace the rewards of raising children.

The Teen Family Centre's Community Program can help Young Parents holistically through:

- Direct Support
- Counseling
- Advocacy
- Workshops & Activities
- One on one needs assessment
- Goal setting
- Referrals to other agencies
- Case Management from a Parent Support Worker

Parent Support Workers are available to provide Young Parents with ongoing support and assistance relating to their parenting and personal day to day needs. The Parent Support Workers can provide outreach and conduct home visits.

What Workshops do the Teen Family Centre run?

At the Teen Family Centre we facilitate a number of Programs for the Community Program based on the needs of our clients attending. Relating to a number of areas including:

- Parenting Skills
- Practical and Independent Living Skills
- Health and Wellbeing
- Personal and Life Development

We have creche facilities available while workshops run.

Who can join the Community Program?

Anyone who is pregnant or parenting who lives within the Community. The Community Program identifies and embraces cultural diversity and caters for the needs of Culturally and Linguistically Diverse and Indigenous Young Parents.

We also welcome and encourage the involvement of Young Fathers, Grand Parents and extended family members.
